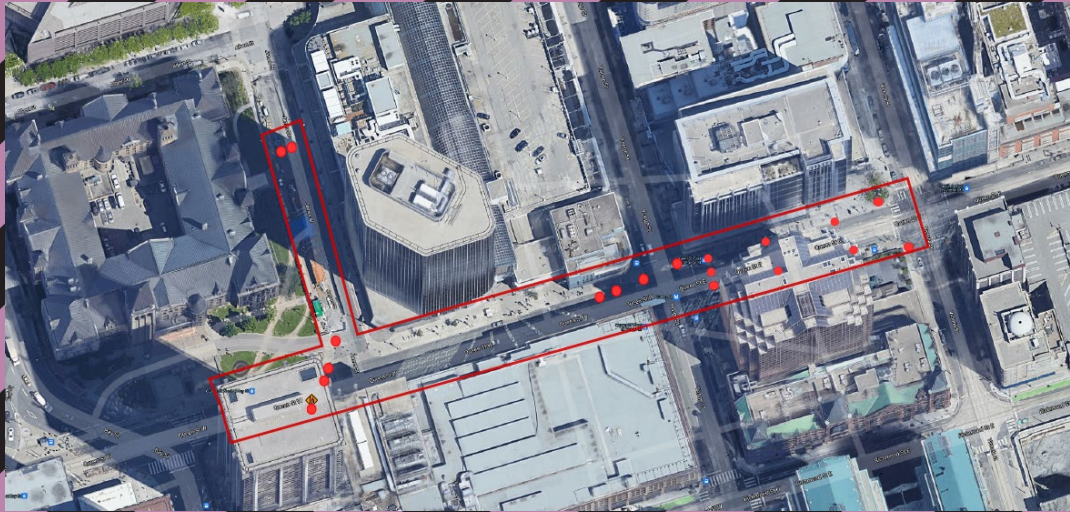


# Overnight investigative hydrovac work along Queen and James Streets, near Yonge Street

Starting as early as June 7, 2021



## What is happening?

To advance design concepts and other structural plans for the Ontario Line, Metrolinx will be using a vacuum truck to gather information and evaluate underground conditions. Using this information, Metrolinx will determine construction details for the project.



## Timing

- **Scheduled start:** June 7, 2021
- **Duration:** 1 week
- **Days:** Monday-Friday
- **Hours:** 9 p.m. to 6:30 a.m.



## What to expect

- During work hours, some lane reductions may be required, and some traffic delays are expected. Sidewalk reductions may be required, but pedestrian access will be maintained at all times. A paid duty officer will be onsite to direct traffic.
- Residents and businesses near the work site can expect to hear noise caused by a drill rig, trucks and other construction equipment related to this work. Every effort will be made to minimize disruptions.
- Please take care and watch for signs directing pedestrians when walking near construction areas. Watch for additional signs directing pedestrians as detours may be required.
- Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.
